- Proper venting in attic spaces to reduce moisture build-up





Elmira couple transforms an outdated main floor into a dream space for family

A year ago, when Brett and Brenda Barriage contemplated moving out of their Elmira house and downsizing to something more contemporary, it was their son who inspired a change of heart.

With their two children grown and married, the Barriages believed their house of 18 years - with its four bedrooms and 3 ½ bathrooms – was too big for the two of them. But after spending several months touring open houses and not finding anything suitable, they were getting discouraged.

Then came Christmas. The couple hosted a family dinner and realized they didn't have enough space for everyone to sit in the same room together for a visit. Brett recalls their son coming up with the

perfect solution. "He told me, you know Dad, you're not going to need less space in the next ten to twenty years," Brett says laughing. "You're going to need more space."

Once Brett and Brenda made the decision to renovate, they surveyed their current space, knowing that a new kitchen would figure largely in their initial plans. "The kitchen was small, old and not very functional," says Brett.

But it was their front room that proved the real catalyst for undertaking a larger renovation. Once used as a home office, the room had gradually become a storage depot. As they envisioned how much space they would have for entertaining if they knocked down the wall separating

this room from the living room, they also imagined other possibilities.

"What about the bathroom and the laundry room, and what about the windows and front door?" Brett says of their discussions to remodel the entire main floor. "We decided that if we're going to go through all of this work and make the dust, let's do it and do it right."

The couple knew a project this big would require a professional contractor to manage the details from start to finish. The decision to contact Darrell Martin at Way-Mar was easy. Besides being satisfied with previous work completed by Way-Mar, Darrell also happens to be Brenda's brother. With this high level of trust and familiarity, Brett and Brenda scheduled the







demolition day and began splitting their time between the basement and their second floor.

After drawing plans and applying for permits, Darrell set out to revitalize the first floor, from new custom cabinetry and a quartz countertop in the kitchen, as well as handscraped engineered hardwood flooring for a modern, rustic appearance, to a new bathroom, laundry space, windows and front door, updated staircase and a former closet-turned recharging station for electronic devices.

As the project progressed, Darrell kept the renovation on pace. He applied new polyurethane spray-foam insulation to the outside walls, adapted to changes in the electrical code and managed several modifications to the original plan. According to Brett, "Way-Mar was really good with all the changes we made along the way. Their response was always, yes, we can do that." Brenda agrees, adding that "working with Way-Mar has been great. They know what they're doing and they know the decisions that need to be made. Practicing What He Teaches

See how UW professor puts his low-energy building expertise into action when insulating his own house

When your life's work is making buildings better, it only makes sense to apply the same principles, techniques and products to the construction of your own home. This is the case with Dr. John Straube, an expert in low-energy building design and building enclosure performance who

divides his time between teaching engineering and architecture courses at the University of Waterloo and his work as a Principal at RDH Building Science Inc.

So when John and his partner, Victoria, purchased a country property on the

outskirts of Waterloo seven years ago, his first priority was to find a company that could retrofit his home with polyurethane spray-foam insulation. Way-Mar fit the bill perfectly.

Soon after they began working together, John realized that Way-Mar could handle every aspect of his growing list of construction plans, including an addition and new garage, along with the collaborative work of testing new products and systems based on his research in energy, comfort and moisture. Installing a variety of insulation products, including spray-foam, cellulose, tongue-and-groove foam board, dense pack cellulose, and stone wool, Way-Mar ensured John's house and garage had exceptionally high levels of insulation.

Although insulation might not be the most glamorous of building products, John con-

When construction wrapped up on the addition, Way-Mar began work on John and Victoria's garage, or what John jokingly refers to as the "Coach House." Rather than insulating between the studs on the exterior walls, Way-Mar installed a continuous layer of stone wool insulation over an airtight and waterproof membrane for higher insulation levels.

"Whether you're building or renovating, it pays in the long-run to invest a little more in your insulation so that it will last for the life of your home."

tends that you cannot overestimate its value. Besides lowering energy costs, which are directly connected to a homeowner's environmental footprint, John asserts that the greatest value of a well-insulated home boils down to two words: comfort and health. "The reason I want a well-insulated and air tight house is because I want a comfortable and healthy home," John says. "If I don't have proper insulation, I end up with cold spots which can lead to condensation, mold and a musty basement."

And while there are other eco-friendly options, like solar panels, they tend to be expensive. "Insulation is an easy way to make a big difference," John maintains. "But because you can't see it, because it's not even attractive when you do see it, people routinely don't make the investment in proper insulation."



Dr. John Straube stands in the unfinished second story of his garage. He maintains that proper insulation allows a homeowner a wider range of heating and cooling equipment while sometimes avoiding the need to run duct work through a house. The future, he says, lies in electric heating, but "we can't actually install electric systems in our climate for affordable heating unless we do a really good job of insulating."



For maximum insulation benefits, Way-Mar's 2 x 3 wood studs stand out from the exterior wall of John's house to allow for a continuous layer of foam. The large gap, according to John, "guarantees the continuity of the air tightness, water tightness, and thermal tightness of the building.'

"Still solid, still strong:" This is how John describes a transitional section of insulation that sticks to the wood stud after being exposed to the elements for close to a year while the addition to his home takes shape.
